Full Service Offering to Support Producers:

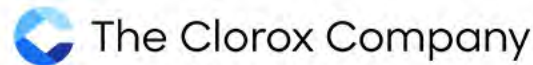
- **National harmonization** of producer services and recycling supply chains to achieve scale and deliver efficiencies.

- Newfoundland and Labrador: Consulting.

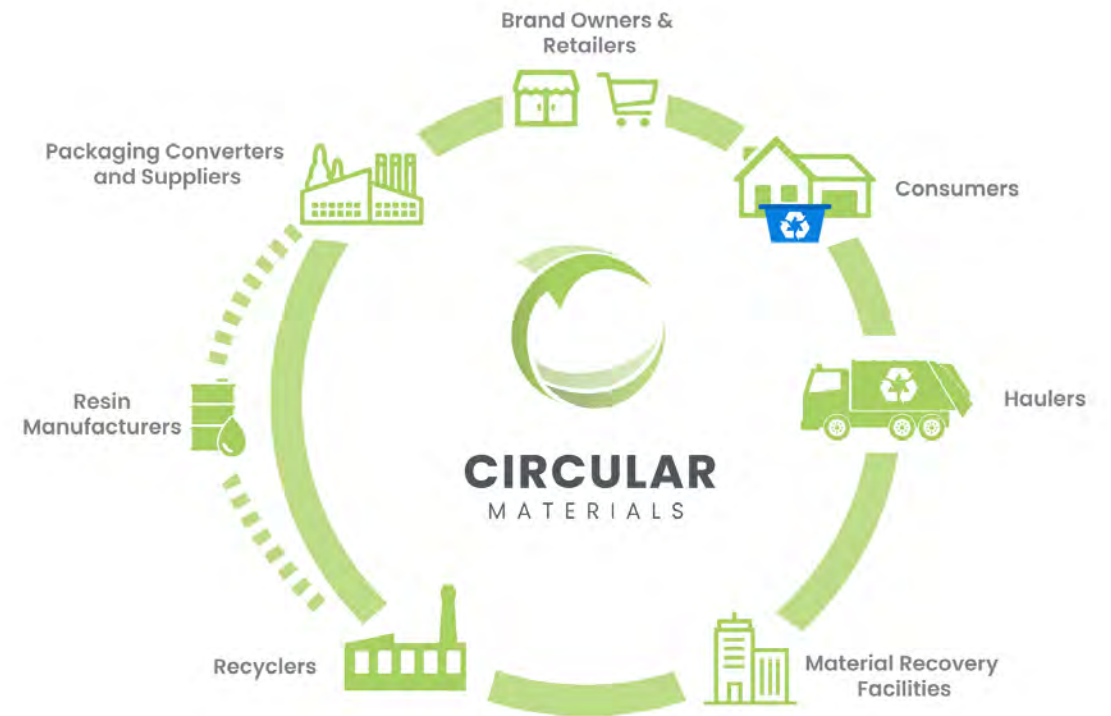
Monitoring:

Advancing the Circular Economy

- Designing recycling supply chains where materials are collected, recycled and returned to producers for use as recycled content in new products and packaging.
- This enhanced, closed-loop system will:
 - Minimize waste and ensure materials are reused again and again.
 - Advance innovation.
 - Increase performance.
 - Deliver improved environmental outcomes.



Collaborating to Address Plastic Waste

- Partnership with the Canada Plastics Pact (CPP) and the Chemistry Industry Association of Canada (CIAC) to accelerate the transition to a circular economy for plastic packaging in Canada.
- Through investments in infrastructure, recycling and innovation, this partnership will:
 - provide solutions to address plastic waste in Canada; and
 - address emerging policy priorities, infrastructure gaps and investment needs.
